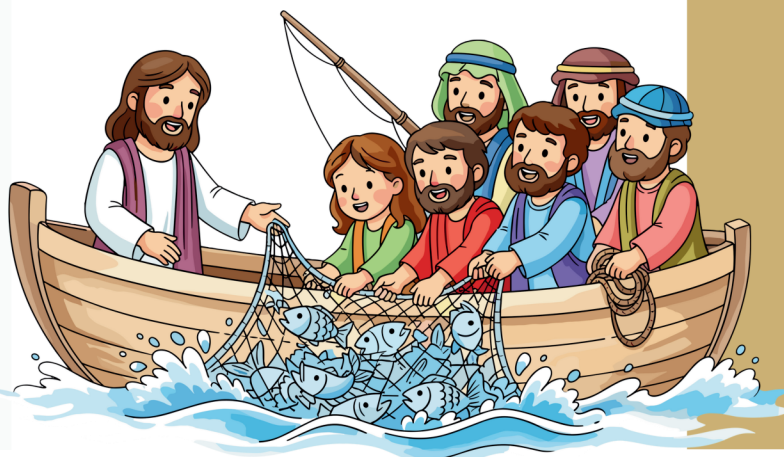

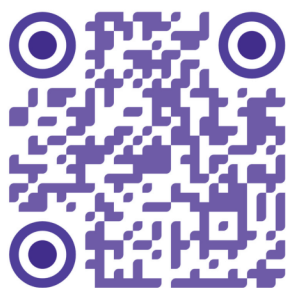

MyParish App

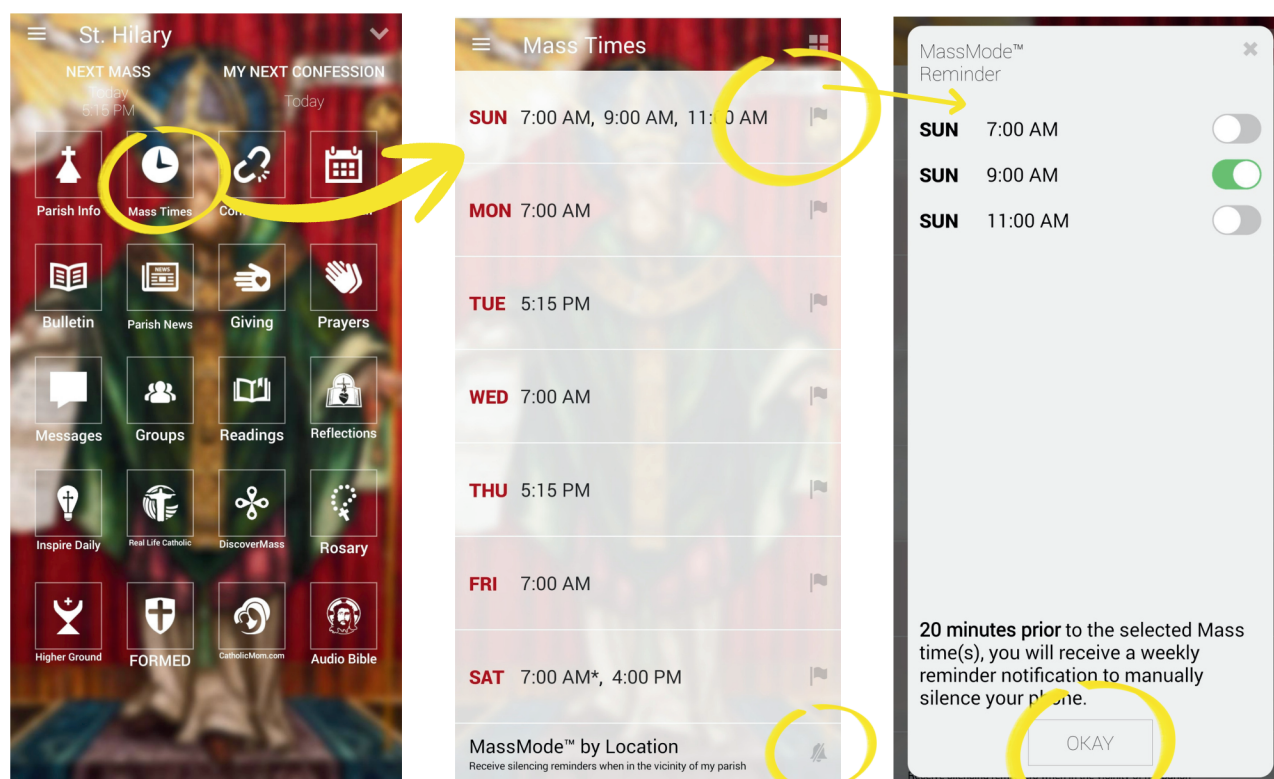


MyParish app

Mass Times

This week's feature is our Mass Times button. Mass Times will allow you to view a list of our regularly offered Mass schedule. (Holy Days of Obligation will always be sent as a message and in our Calendar which we will feature soon.) When you click on the flag to the right of the Mass you are planning to attend, you will have the option to get a reminder 20 minutes before the beginning of that particular Mass. Just click the toggle to the right and click "OKAY" at the bottom. "MassMode by Location" will alert you when you come into the vicinity of St. Hilary as a reminder to silence your cell phone. How cool is that?? You just click the bell icon in the bottom right corner of the Mass Times list.
